4. Here is a circle, centre $O$, and the tangent to the circle at the point $(2,-4)$.


Find the equation of the tangent at the point $P$.

$$
\begin{gather*}
\text { gradient of } O P=-2 \\
y=\frac{1}{2} x+C \\
-4=1+c  \tag{1}\\
C=-5
\end{gather*}
$$

5. Here is a circle, centre $O$, and the tangent to the circle at the point $(6,8)$.


Find the equation of the tangent at the point $P$.
gradient of $O P=\frac{4}{3}$

$$
\begin{array}{ll}
y=-\frac{3}{4} x+c & y=-\frac{3}{4} x+\frac{25}{2} \\
8=-4.5+c & y=-0.75 x+12.5 \\
c=12.5 &
\end{array}
$$

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6. The line $I$ is a tangent to the circle $x^{2}+y^{2}=68$ at the point $P$. $P$ is the point $(2,8)$

Work out the equation of the line I gradient of OP =4

$$
\begin{aligned}
y & =-\frac{1}{4} x+c \\
8 & =-\frac{1}{2}+c \\
c & =8 \frac{1}{2} \text { or } 8.5
\end{aligned}
$$

& y=-0.25 x+8 \cdot 5 \\
& y=-\frac{1}{4} x+\frac{17}{2}
\end{aligned}
$$

7. $\quad$ The diagram shows the circle $x^{2}+y^{2}=17$

1^{2}+y^{2} & =17 \\
y & = \pm 4
\end{aligned}

$P$ lies on the circle and has $x$-coordinate 1. $(1,4)$
The tangent at $P$ intersects the $x$-axis at $R$.

y=-0.25 x+4.25

8. The line $l$ is a tangent to the circle $x^{2}+y^{2}=90$ at the point $P$.
$P$ is the point $(3,9)$
The line / crosses the x-axis at the point Q .
Work out the area of triangle OPQ.

\text { gradient of } O P=3 & Q \\
y=-\frac{1}{3} x+c & 0=-\frac{1}{3} x+10 \\
q=-1+c & x=30 \\
c=10 & Q(30,0) \\
y=-\frac{1}{3} x+10 &
\end{array}>.

9. The circle $\mathrm{x}^{2}+\mathrm{y}^{2}=25$ has tangents at the points A and B .

The point A has coordinates $(0,5)$
The point B has coordinates $(3,-4)$

$$
